

## **MISIC Resources for Teachers & Leaders of TAG, Title, At-Risk, Inclusion, and Resource Programs – Nancy Lockett**

This session is intended for any administrator who coordinates their district Special Programs and any teacher of TAG, Title, At-Risk, Inclusion Program and Resource Room Programs.

This session will address MISIC, its origins, its mission, its history, and its resources. Also, addresses will be MISIC's partnership with NWEA. Participants will become familiar with the recommended accommodations for the MAP test and what that means to their students along with guides to help students and parents. Attention will also be given to the connection between MISIC's Standards and Benchmarks and the Iowa Core Curriculum and how that might relate to IEPs.

Participants are encouraged to bring passwords that allow them to view their district's MAP data. If they haven't been assigned one, they might contact their district MAP Coordinator for a district one that they could use. Lap tops would be nice to have, but not a must.

Participants will be provided a list of electronically accessible resources, a handout over-viewing NWEA and MISIC and a power point that they could use with their colleagues.

## **Using MAP form Primary Grades (MPG) Data – John Woodin**

Map for Primary Grades (MPG) Data is much more than the reports we get from the Survey with Goals tests, which are given during the regular testing window. MPG data can be used in dozens of creative ways to enhance instruction. Because of the nature of the MPG **Screening** and **Skills Checklist** modules (which can be given at any time and as many times as you wish), MPG is data is ongoing, and can be used as often as appropriate.

This session will help schools using MPG (or those THINKING of using MPG) discover ways to use MPG data creatively to guide instruction in Kindergarten, First and Second grades.

## **Advanced Curriculum Manager – Jamie Morgan**

This session is for administrators and teachers from schools that are currently using Curriculum Manager and want to further explore the features and reports that are available in the program.

This session will look at features in Curriculum Manager that we have not introduced in previous sessions. We will look at some more of the reports that are available now that teachers have begun to enter their units. We will also look at features such as creating lesson plan templates and resources that can be accessible and used in the whole district.
